CONDOLENCE MESSAGE



The sudden and untimely demise of Prof. (Dr.) Mool Chand Sharma, Former Professor-in-Charge, Campus Law Centre (University of Delhi) brings us all profound sorrow. He was an alumnus of the Campus Law Centre, and later on, served as a distinguished Professor of Law at the CLC. He was also the Founder Vice Chancellor of Central University of Haryana, and was widely known amongst scholars and legal fraternity as a thought activist, institution-builder, and a teacher who inspired and motivated generations of students. Professor Sharma held a Doctorate degree in Juridical Science (SJD) from North Western University Law School, Chicago. He also held

numerous prestigious awards to his credit. He also held several other prestigious scientific research and academic positions, from time to time, including- Vice-Chairperson, University Grants Commission (UGC); Director, National Law Institute University, Bhopal; Senior Research Advisor, National Human Rights Commission; Expert Legal Advisor, Law Commission of India; National Commission for Women; National Research Advisor, Ford Foundation, India; Joint Registrar of Research, Supreme Court of India; and Full Time Member of the Law Commission of India. He was also invited by numerous universities, educational and other institutions as senior fellow and scholar. He was also invited on a number of Task Forces and Committees, constituted for providing inputs to national policy making on complex issues, which testified his deep understanding of interplay amongst finer nuances of Democracy; Rule of Law; Diversity and Development and Distributive Justice; Human Rights Jurisprudence. Apart from numerous research papers Professor Sharma authored/edited several books.

The teaching and non-teaching staff and students of the Faculty of Law mourn his demise, and convey our heartfelt condolences on his bereavement. The Nation has lost a great legal academic. We pray to Almighty to give his bereaved family strength to bear this great loss with courage and fortitude. An online condolence and prayer meeting to pay homage to the departed soul was held at 12.00 noon on 08 September, 2020.
